

SMALLBORE RIFLE

Rule changes effective 2013

● **2.6.1 Military Veteran** – Former military personnel, other than active duty or reserve, in possession of any one of the following documents; Form DD-214, retired military identification card or membership in a veteran's organization are allowed to compete.

● **2.11 Club Teams** –

(b) Open Club Teams – Open Club Teams must be composed of members all of whom are not necessarily legal residents in the same state, territory or province. This definition is intended to include members of Military Veterans Teams. (A single club could have more than one team, one of which could be a Local Club and another an Open Club Team).

● **2.11.1 Affiliated Other Organization** – All members including team captains and coach of such teams must have been fully-paid members of the organization the team represents or maintained on its roster, for a period of at least 30 days immediately prior to competition and the organization must be affiliated with the NRA in good standing.

● **2.13.1 Military Veterans Teams** – Former military personnel, including Team Captains and firing Coach, other than active duty or reserve, in possession of any one of the following documents; Form DD-214, retired military identification card or membership in a veterans' organization are allowed to form a legal team and compete.

● **4.6 50 Yard Target.** A-23/3 – 3 bullseyes, A/23-5, 5 bullseyes, and A-23/6, 6 bullseyes. For use in Conventional 4-Position and 50 yard stage of Conventional Prone competitions. 7 through 10 rings black

● **4.7 50 Yard Target.** A-27/3 – 3 bullseyes, A/27-5, 5 bullseyes, and A-27/6, 6 bullseyes. For use in Conventional Prone competitions. 3.89 inches diameter black.

● **4.9 50 Yard Target.** A-26/3 – 3 bullseyes, A/26-5, 5 bullseyes, and A-26/6, 6 bullseyes. For use in Conventional Prone competitions. 4.27 inches diameter black

● **3.10 Ground Cloth** - Ground cloth may be used providing it is not constructed or used in a manner to provide artificial rest or support. *This is not to preclude the use of more than one ground cloth.*

● **14.3 How to Score** -

(f) Center Shots - Those shot holes fired on targets without X-ring (A-7, A-17, A-32, A-33, A-50, and A-51) are used to break ties and rank scores (Center Shots are not scored on NRA/USAS-50 targets). *Ties are broken starting with Rule 15.7.2(b)(2).* Center shots are determined as follows:

● **14.7 Excessive Hits**

(b) Delete "An excessive hit fired on a target other than your own will be brought back as a miss (0)"

● **14.10 Hits on Wrong Target or Bullseye**

(a) All cross-fires for metric and conventional smallbore competition, both external and internal cross-fires will be assessed one penalty point. Shots fired onto another competitor's sighter bull are not penalized under this rule. (See Rule 9.25).

If the actual hit(s) to be transferred cannot be established clearly, the hit(s) with the lowest value must be transferred to the bull with insufficient hit(s) so the shooter will gain no advantage in a tie breaking situation.

● **17.5 Course of Fire for Which National Records are Recognized**

Note: National Smallbore Rifle Records are maintained for scores fired with Metallic and with Any

Sights over the following courses for Open, Civilian, Regular Service, Reserve components including National Guard, Women, Senior, Junior, Intermediate Junior, and Sub-Junior categories. (See Rule 8.2 for time allowances.)
