Changes for 2013

2.6 Military Veteran – Former military personnel, other than active duty or reserve, in possession of any one of the following documents: Form DD 214, retired military identification card such as Veterans Administration card, or membership card in a Veterans' organization may be allowed to compete.

2.7 – 2.9 Blank

2.11 Club Teams – All team members, including team captain and coach of such teams, must have been active fully-paid members of the club which the team represents for a period of at least 30 days immediately prior to the competition. The club may be affiliated with the NRA. If specifically allowed by conditions of the program, a person who is not a club member may serve as a non-firing coach of such a team. There are two types of teams allowed under this rule:

(a) Local Club Teams – Local Club Teams must be composed of members who reside within the same state, territory or province or residents of other states who live within 50 miles of the local club.

(b) Open Club Teams – Open Club teams must be composed of members all of whom are not necessarily legal resident in the same state, territory or province. This definition is intended to include members of Military Veterans Teams. (A single club could have more than one team, one of which could be a Local Club and another an Open Club Team).

NOTE: The Internet website "MapQuest" will be used to determine the distance between the local club's NRA address of record and the competitor's NRA address of record..

2.11.1 Other Affiliated Organizations – All team members, including team captain and coach, must have been active fully-paid members of the club which the team represents for a period of at least 30 days immediately prior to the competition

2.13 Military Veteran Teams – Former military personnel, including team Captains and firing Coach, other than active duty or reserve, in possession of any one of the following documents: DD 214, retired military identification card, Veterans' Administration card, or membership card in a Veterans' organization may be allowed to form a legal team and compete.

2.14 – 2.19 Blank

3.1.3 Cowboy Lever Action Silhouette Rifle –

(a) Rear sights may be open, receiver, or tang sights, mounted as originally intended. No extended mounts are permitted. The front sight must be a post or bead or if changeable inserts, may use a post or bead insert only. A front sight anti-glare tube, which may be no longer than 1 1/8" to include any attachments and no larger than a 3/4" outside diameter, may be used.

Fiber optic material may be used in or on the post or bead and may not be longer than its support blade and not to exceed 1 1/8" in length. In an anti-glare tube, the fiber optic material may not be any longer than the tube or extend outside the tube. *The fiber optic sights do not need to be commercially manufactured.*
