TARGET: NRA Official Targets will be used (Section 4, NRA Rules).

CHALLENGES: A challenge fee of \$1.00 will be charged for each challenge made. (NRA Rule Book section 16).

SQUADDING: All matches will be squadded. Squadding will be done by the Statistical Office. Competitors are responsible for proof of classification. Squadding information for team matches will be announced on range. A competitor who fails to present himself at the proper firing point when his relay is called may lose his right to compete in that event.

CLASSIFICATION: The NRA classification system will be used in all matches. **NRA classification cards may be checked by the Statistical Officer.** Unclassified competitors will compete in the Master Class. Rule 19.6 - Assigned Classification, or 19.2 - Temporary Classification, may be used in making entry in an NRA Regional tournament.

AWARDS: To the Winner, 2nd, and 3rd place overall a medallion (provided entries warrant). To the winning team 1st place team medals to each firing member. Awards are furnished by the NRA. The tournament sponsor **will** provide other awards for all **fired** matches and **aggregates**. Sponsor will post on the bulletin board an award schedule after entries have closed and before the tournament begins. (Generally at least 50% of match entry fees should be given in awards to the class/category winners.)

CLASS AND CATEGORY: NRA will provide a medal to each class winner with a minimum of five (5) in the class. Camp Perry entry fee credit certificates will be provided, see page 3 for schedule.

SPECIAL AWARDS: Optional (Senior and Junior) -- An individual winning a place award shall be entitled to Special Awards for which he or she is qualified, but may not win a category/class award in the same match. Such awards will be passed down to the next eligible competitor. To be eligible for a Special Award the individual must indicate on his or her entry card the groups represented.

CLASS AWARDS: Optional (after the winner in each class is provided for)—The category/class awards will also be passed down, as described above, if an individual is the winner of a Special Award.

REGIONAL AWARDS SCHEDULE

(Furnished by the NRA)

GRAND AGGREGATE

Winner: NRA Regional Gold Medallion (with a minimum of 8 shooters)
2nd Place: NRA Regional Silver Medallion (with a minimum of 10 shooters)
3rd Place: NRA Regional Bronze Medallion (with minimum of 15 shooters)

AWARDS FOR FIRED TEAM MATCHES - METALLIC SIGHT AND ANY SIGHT

For the winning team, a 1st place team medal will be awarded each firing member.

NRA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP CERTIFICATE AWARD

Certificates for 50% Off Camp Perry or the National Metric Championship entry fees are awarded to Class winners. Only one award may be earned per class. At least 10 shooters must be in a class to win a certificate. Classes may be combined upward (NRA Rule 19.8.1) to make a class of 10 shooters. Regionals of less than ten shooters are not eligible for the NRA National Smallbore Rifle Championship Certificate. Certificates are won in NRA Conventional/Metric Prone Regionals and in NRA 3-Position or Conventional Position Regionals. Only one Prone certificate may be won per year. Only one Position Certificate may be earned per year. A shooter may earn one prone and one position certificate per year and both certificates may be applied to the National Smallbore Rifle Championships if a shooter desires to shoot both championships. Certificates may be passed down to the next lower shooter in a class at the same Regional tournament. The Regional winner will receive a certificate and be counted in the class to which he or she belongs. Certificates are the property of the NRA who may refuse to honor any certificates for any reason at anytime.

Sponsor Note:

All sponsors will receive Certificate guidelines when they receive their awards package. These guidelines should be posted on the bulletin board at the match.

AWARDS FURNISHED BY TOURNAMENT SPONSOR

CATEGORY AND CLASS AWARDS (GRAND AGGREGATE)

For each class in each category:

1st Place - minimum of 5 shooters in category/class 2nd Place - with 8 or more shooters in category/class 3rd Place - with 13 or more shooters in category/class

AWARDS FOR INDIVIDUAL FIRED MATCHES

The number of competitors in a class in a category will determine the amount of awards as above. Five competitors establish a class in a category and 1st place, 8 competitors 2nd place, 13 competitors, 3rd etc.

NOTE: See award schedule on bulletin board for all individual matches.

<u>NOTE</u>: The above schedule DOES NOT apply to the National Championship Certificate Award. A minimum of 10 per class is required for each certificate.

<u>NOTE</u>: Tournament sponsor should state in program what the awards will be (cash, points, trophies, etc.) and approximately what the distribution system will be (as above).
