

NORWEGIAN TROPHY



The Norwegian Trophy is a striking example of Scandinavian crystal. An oval bowl measuring approximately 6½ inches high and 11½ inches wide. Erroneously called the Swedish Trophy for some years, the trophy was won at the 1961 World Moving Target Championships in Oslo, Norway, by the gold medal winning U.S. Clay Pigeon Team. It was designated by NRA in 1980 for International-type Competition.

Awarded to the indoor International Rifle Sectional, Woman's National Champion. Redisgnated in 2016 to the winner of the NRA Intercollegiate Rifle Club Championships Individual Smallbore Rifle Championship.

Match Conditions:

1980 An aggregate of 40 shots prone, 40 shots standing and 40 shots kneeling.
2016 20 shots prone, 20 shots standing, and 20 shots kneeling.
