

REDFIELD TROPHY



The Redfield Trophy is an upright, sterling silver global-type vase, with three handles placed evenly around the vase and directly over the three pedestals at the base. The trophy is decorated with three dimensional flowers and leaves. It sits upon a black painted wooden base which contains a plaque displaying information on the trophy. In 1955, Watt Redfield of Redfield Gunsight Co., Denver, CO, donated the trophy to the NRA. Awarded annually to the individual rifle champion in the NRA National Intercollegiate Indoor Championships.

Match Conditions:

- 1955 Awarded to the Collegiate Sectional Winner. Course of fire: 30 shots, 3-positions (prone, standing and kneeling).
- 1975 Target change from conventional A-17 to NRA A-36 target.
- 1979 Trophy winner changed from 300 point aggregate under the NRA 3-Position Rules, to 1200 point aggregate under the NRA International Rules.
- 1980 Rededicated for competition in the NCAA Rifle Championships and awarded to the NCAA Smallbore Rifle Champion.
- 1982 Rededicated for competition in the NRA Intercollegiate Sectionals and awarded to the smallbore rifle shooter with the highest score. Course of fire: 3-Position, 1200 shots aggregate.
- 2005 Course of fire changed to 60 shots per team member.
